Case accomplishments include:

- Clean Air Act (CAA) settlement requiring installation of scrubber system to remove up to 16,550 pounds of ethylene oxide and three supplemental environmental projects (SEPS), emergency equipment purchase, purchase of two mobile health units, and provision of medical services to benefit local environmental justice communities.
- CAA litigation resulting in consent decree with \$9 million in innovative relief to reduce a refinery's annual greenhouse gas emissions by 12,888 tons and payment of \$13 million in civil and stipulated penalties for statutory and past consent decree violations.
- Clean Water Act (CWA) settlement that included a 38-acre land set aside SEP with hiking trails and 20-acre riparian spawning corridor for threatened salmon populations under the Endangered Species Act (ESA).
- Multi-agency Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) settlement including recovery of \$6 million in past response costs despite significant litigation risk and contentious mediation.

Developed and implemented case strategy, led negotiation sessions, drafted consent decree language, drafted referrals and CWA information requests, worked closely with regional EPA attorneys and DOJ, and oversaw expert contractors for CWA enforcement actions in various stages of litigation, mediation, and settlement. Briefed high-level EPA managers on politically sensitive CWA case and policy issues. Drafted policy documents and correspondence to guide CWA enforcement actions, led portion of EPA and DOJ attorney training on CWA municipal enforcement. Served as acting Branch Chief from April 2016 through July 2016 and managed legal interns. Case accomplishments include:

- CWA settlement requiring San Antonio Water System (SAWS) to pay a civil penalty of \$2,600,000 and implement approximately \$1.1 million of injunctive relief focused on immediate repairs to SAWS' sewer system with a focus on improvements to reduce sewage overflows in historically overburdened communities.
- CWA partial settlement with City of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania to remedy years of neglecting to maintain its aging sewer system. Under the settlement, Harrisburg implemented approximately \$82 million of

- injunctive relief to address chronic underinvestment in sewer and wastewater systems combined with Harrisburg's extreme financial distress.
- CWA settlement requiring the City of Ft. Smith, Arkansas to implement over \$255 million of injunctive relief to address several thousand illegal sewage overflows and effluent violations, pay of a civil penalty of \$300,000, and perform a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) valued at approximately \$400,000 to repair and replace leaking private laterals for low-income homeowners.
