The below October 8, 2003 email from Assistant Commissioner Hahn to Chief of Staff Sondermeyer documents that Commissioner Campbell killed the wildlife criteria proposal shortly after September meetings with the Chemistry Council. According to an October 2, 2005 letter from the Chemistry Council to Assistant Commissioner Hahn (see link), Campbell met with Chemistry Council members the last week of September. Hahn and DEP scientists again met with the Chemistry Council on September 16, 2005. Both these meetings were improper because they took place after the public comment period on the rule proposal had closed, and prior to the Commissioner's final decision on the November 2002 proposal.
