\*\* Some of the species may have been intentionally killed by M-44s (i.e., coyotes), while others are considered by Wildlife Services to be "non-target" species. That is, their deaths caused by sodium cyanide M-44 devices were unintentional. Non-target species likely include eagles, domestic dogs, ravens, and ringtails. The non-target kills vary from animal-to-animal and from year-to-year.
